## WHAT'S ISHMAEL ZAMORA'S 40 TIME?

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
Ishmael Zamora isn't a quarterback like Tom Brady or Lamar Jackson, who once were the focus of a 40-yard dash challenge.

But you might wonder how the 40 yard dash challenge relates to Ishmael Zamora.

Potential players are evaluated on their speed, which can influence a player's draft-ability. Every football player wants to have a fast 40-yard dash time as a result. A quick 40 gets attention and attracts coaches and scouts. It's also a plus on the field. Although speed alone doesn't make a star wide receiver, speed can make the difference when a pass is caught.

In continuation of his love for playing football, Zamora, a free agent, completed a stint in the National Arena League. In the National Arena League (NAL), Zamora rightfully and genuinely earned the trust of his teammates [https://primetimesportstalk.com/2019/05/01/zamora-makes-impact-on-field-mere-hours-into-pirates-tenure/?fbclid=lwAR1lX3ZwPYcqosvBrWm-tycXrbj5y-bmv1GFIKfppOJJLkYL1UHK7NtmrcU].

During his time working with the Massachusetts Pirates, Zamora demonstrated that he does score touchdowns when provided the opportunity. Speaking to Zamora's actual potential, then Pirates quarterback, Sean Brackett, remarked that Zamora would "be another great weapon" on the field. In the NAL, Zamora maintained his playbook studies in furtherance of his wide receiver potentials.

During Zamora's stint with the Oakland Raider's, Zamora was provided the opportunity to tap into a more professional skillset, learning more complex playbook routes and further honing his 40 yard time.

NFL.com summarized Zamora's potential as follows:

"...able to mismatch smaller cornerbacks in the NFL. Size/speed prospect with build-up acceleration to climb over cornerbacks. Possesses untapped potential...Flashes separation juice out of his route stems. Ball tracking is adequate. Plays to his size after the catch and can be a punishing runner while banging through tackle attempts for additional yardage." Zamora is known for his jumping ability and for high pointing the ball.

During his football career at Baylor University, Zamora made notable accomplishments: "In 23 games, eight starts, over two years with the Bears, the 6-foot-3, 224-pounder had 72 catches for 941 yards and 10 touchdowns. He averaged 6.3 catches per game as a sophomore, second in the Big 12." [https://www.espn.com/blog/oakland-raiders/post/\_/id/18394/former-baylor-wr-ishmael-zamora-among-raiders-18-udfas] His 40 time no doubt made him a team asset. Zamora started a career in football after Kendall Briles spotted him in the Texas Southern University Relay competition. Briles was impressed by Zamora's speed and height. Zamora is an accomplished record maker in the 100-meter hurdle race, as recorded in the Texas State Relay competition.

To improve performance on the field, football players spend months training at elite sports performance facilities to improve their 40-yard dash times—as well as their performance on other positional tests. Players achieve their goals with strength work and constant practice to hone their technique. Like other athletes, Zamora put in hours completing valuable training in such programs and continues to maintain his 40 time to show he's still got what it takes to play the game.

Zamora physically trains and participates in local matches.
